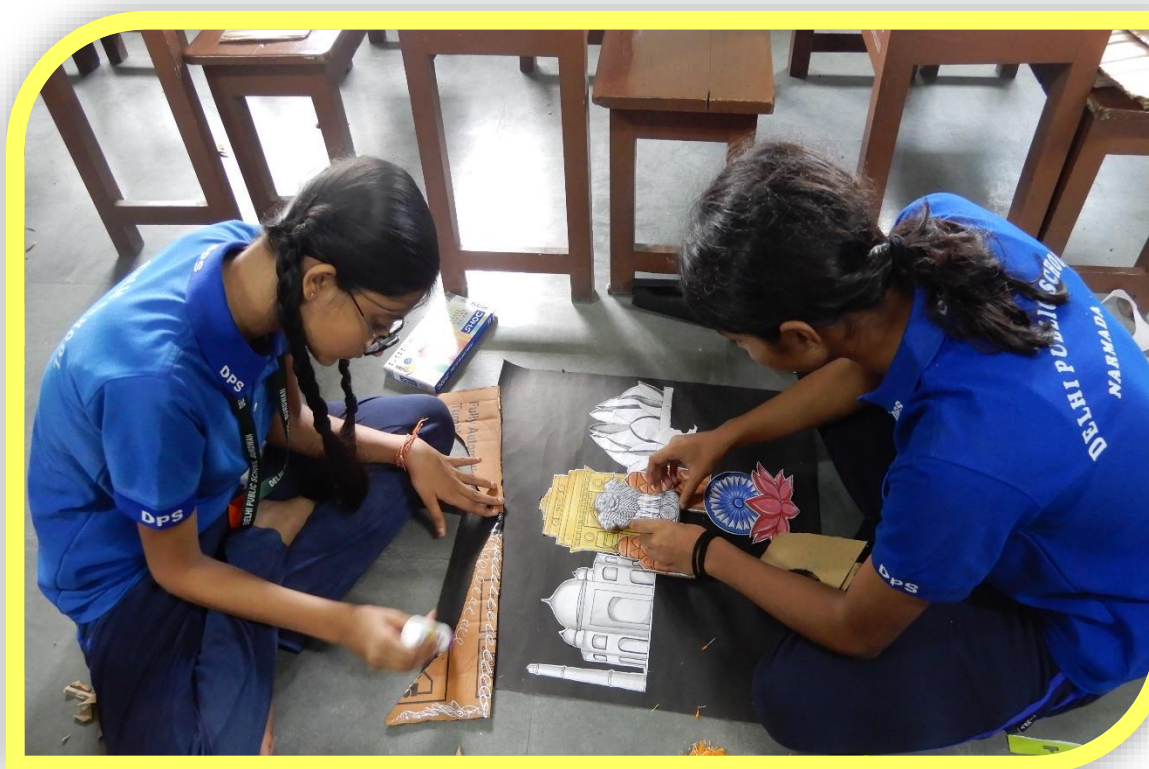

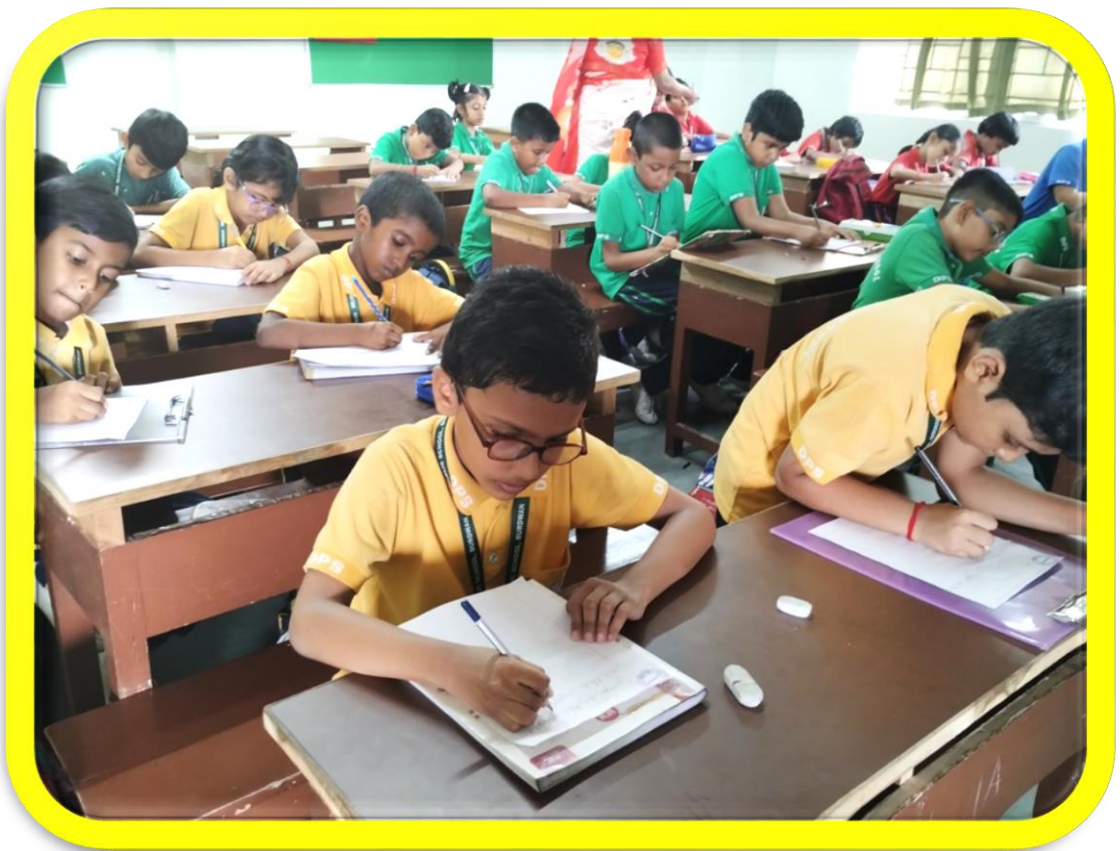

## Digital Club

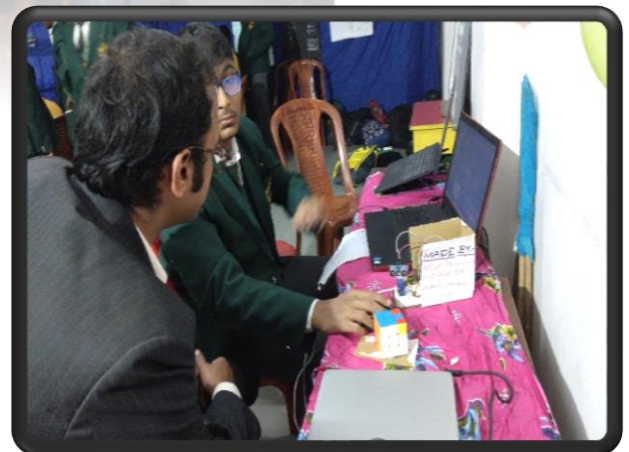
The Digital Club of our school has been actively promoting digital literacy and coding skills among students through a variety of engaging activities.

- **She concluded the season with her participation in the 68th West Bengal State Council for School Games and Sports (30th August 2024), where she was awarded a Certificate of Participation.**

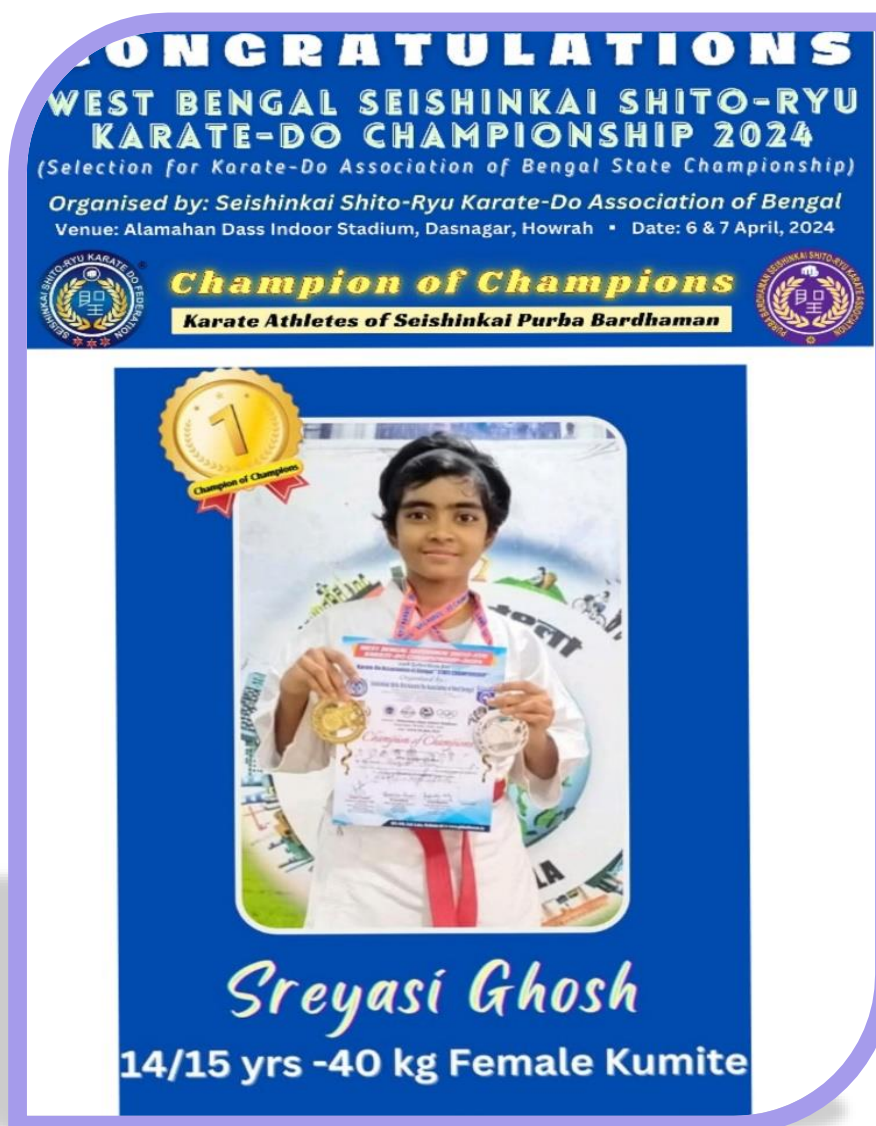
